



Carry 2 litres of water per person. Drinking water from waterfalls and creeks is not recommended.

Getting There

Follow the **Great Western Highway** and turn onto the clearly marked **Evans Lookout Road**, just south of Blackheath Village. After 2.9 kilometres you will arrive at the **Neates Glen car park** on the right side of the road.

Taxi, Bus and Train

Local taxis are a convenient and affordable option for small groups. They are readily available in Leura and Katoomba.

There are bus and train services to **Blackheath Village**. They are not frequent so plan ahead. You can find timetable information at <u>www.transportnsw.info</u> or call 131 500.

Walking from Blackheath Village (4.2km)

Follow **Govetts Leap Road** away from the highway. Take the first right onto **Wentworth Road**. Continue for 1.6km (approx. 20 mins). Just before the Golf Course the road changes name to Valley View Road. After the Golf Club take the second left onto **Evans Lookout Road**. Walk for another 2.6km (25-30 mins) to the **Neates Glen car park**. Neates Glen to Evans Lookout return loop 5.5km – 3 to 4 hrs 400m descent/ascent

Route

Start your walk from **Neates Glen car park** by following the trail downhill. As you descend you will discover a hidden rainforest of bright ferns, trickling creeks, impressive rock shelters and a short tunnel. Follow the stairs and bridges, stepping across narrow gorges and winding your way into the depths of the spectacular **Grand Canyon**. From here the track follows the creek, passing peaceful waterholes where you can stop for a swim.

After 2-3 hours of walking you come to a track junction. Take a moment to rest at the creek before you start the long, steep walk up to **Evans Lookout**. It is about an hour to the top, so stop to rest and take in the changing environment along the way. At **Evans Lookout** you will be rewarded with a stunning view of the Grose Valley. From here, take the marked track through the bush on the left side of the road to the **Neates Glen car park**.

Looking for more?

The **Grand Canyon** is a gateway to the breathtaking Grose Valley. Branching off from the Grand Canyon walk you will find a variety of trails: please consider your abilities carefully. To enjoy panoramic views of the Grose Valley, follow the **Clifftop Walk** to the Braeside Track and Govetts Leap (moderate, 3km). For closet historians, take the **Point Pilcher Track** to Medlow Bath (steep, 6km). A walk to Junction Rock via the **Horse Track** or **Rodriguez Pass** (steep, 8km) takes you into the heart of the Grose Valley. If you are prepared for an overnight adventure, discover the Blue Gum Forest via Govetts Creek (8km one way, not pictured).
